

"Are You in the Christmas Spirit?"

Ready or not, here comes Christmas! Thanksgiving and Black Friday will soon be in our rearview mirror. But we don't even have to wait anymore till Thanksgiving is over to start getting in the Christmas mode. Retailers make sure of that by putting up decorations and advertising earlier and earlier every year. Stores across the land and city lights seem to go up earlier and earlier as well. As a young boy growing up in my community, I couldn't wait until the streetlights went up in the little towns of Red Lion and Dallastown, PA. But I never remember them going up until after Thanksgiving. As we get more commercialized in our society, retailers are always looking for ways to sell their product to us as the consumer. They tell us, "Get it now and save money," or "it's coming soon, so get ready for the sale." So are you in the Christmas Spirit yet? Have you gotten all your Christmas shopping done or are you like me and wait until the eleventh hour?

It makes me wonder how it was for Mary and Joseph leading up to the very first Christmas as they anticipated the birth of their newborn Son. I'm sure they had their things they too had to get ready for, such as getting the nursery ready, etc.

During the Advent Season, we look forward to all that it brings (Advent is a Latin word that simply means, "Coming or Arrival"). We celebrate the coming (birth) of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, just as Mary and Joseph did. Jesus is the reason for the season! Two thousand years ago the world waited for the coming of the promised Messiah. Then one day it happened just as the prophets of old said it would. "This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said. "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take

Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins. All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us" (Matthew 1:18-23).

Today we still celebrate Jesus' coming, we call it Christmas. Let us remember the real reason for the season! But there is another day that we as Christians are looking forward to; another coming (Advent). We call this the "Second Coming," when Jesus will return to take us to our eternal home in Heaven! Now, it does not get any better than that! We not only have this promised gift of salvation, but we also get all the gifts that go along with it in Heaven when Jesus returns again!

This Christmas season and throughout the year, let us give thanks for what our Savior has done for us! Jesus is the gift that keeps on giving!

We want to begin by thanking you for continuing to believe in our ministry. Your prayers, affirming words and financial support mean a great deal to us. Your partnership in ministry with us is helping to change lives. God is good.

As we reflect over this past year, what comes to mind is "this is not what we expected." In late January, Mike received a message from a friend asking if we would consider helping the West Goshen Church. We learned they were facing a challenging time and the few people that remained were quite discouraged. We had a relationship with them from the past and felt God prompting us to contact the church.

The Leadership Team at the church showed interested in meeting with us and sharing their story. Following that meeting we spent time in prayer seeking God's direction. We felt God leading us to offer our help and we pitched an idea to them which has now become an incredibly unique arrangement. We told them they could not hire us because we had worked hard to build our support base for our own ministry, and we did not want to lose that or the work we do through On Community. We told them we could not come and help them alone; we would be bringing a team of people to help us. And due to Mike's health concerns, we would not be able to stay if it became stressful. They agreed to our terms and insisted on at least giving a contribution to our ministry. We consented. They have accepted the limited amount of time we can give them while maintaining the ministry of One Community. We completed a six-month commitment and greed to six more months. We will continue to listen to God for direction for our future.

Every December we invit you to a Christmas Service to thank you for your support throughout the year. We wanted to let you know we are combining our annual Christmas Service with the West Goshen annual Christmas Eve Service this year at 6:00 pm, Tuesday, December 24.
